SINGLE'S MINISTRIES ARE GREAT!

Single's ministries are popular all over the country. That's great! But if we are not careful, single's ministries can isolate singles from the whole family of God.

SINGLE PEOPLE NEED GOD'S FAMILY

Being only one person has draw backs single people, even those completely content to be single, recognize. For instance, "Have you ever tried to play checkers with yourself? How about tic tac toe?"

United Intergenerational Ministry or UIM is about ministry to all generations, every age and situation including singles - at the same time - all together. 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Faith, Character, and Love Help Stepparents Succeed!

STEPPARENT SURVIVAL

Becoming "stepparent of the year" is a commendable goal, but most stepparents just pray to survive. Some stepparents have suffered the failure of their marriage and others have suffered the loss of a beloved spouse through death. There are others who face the instant family drama of parenting their spouses children. The reality is that there is precious little time to think about becoming "stepparent of the year," but we all have to have dreams. Right?

GET RID OF GUILT

Yes divorces carry guilt, but bringing it into a stepparent relationship only increases the stress already present. So, get rid of all guilt by seeking the forgiveness God promises to all who confess their sins to Him. We all sin. Our confession and forgiveness open our hearts and lives up to faith and the character of Christ that equips and empowers stepparents to be the forgiven children He has made it possible for them to be for their stepchildren.

GET RID OF SORROW

The death of a spouse can leave the spouse who remains in deep grief. Sorrow, even if you try to keep it hidden, can hinder you from being the best stepparent you can be. So cling to Christ and His Word that can turn your grief into the joy and peace of Christ and bless both you and your stepchildren.

SEEK GOD'S GUIDANCE

If you desire to be the best stepparent you can be, seek God's guidance in His Word, ask for His help in prayer. Stay close to Him in Worship, and He will help you to be more like Him in all that you say and do. Through the power of His Holy Spirit, He will strengthen and fashion you in faith and character to be exactly the right stepparent your stepchildren need for their faith and lives.

STEPPARENT TIPS: From some who have traveled the stepparent road:

- Loving a person does not mean feelings of love will come immediately for each of that person's children. You must choose to love another person's children and ask God to help you. Then, trust and know that God will hear and answer your prayer.
- Never try to replace a parent. Rather, be one more person who gives your stepchildren support and love.
- Get rid of all bitterness from past and present relationships. If necessary, seek the help of your pastor, a strong Christian friend, or professional Christian counseling. Bitterness can quickly destroy a stepparent/child relationship and every relationship.
- Support both parents of your stepchild unless it harms your stepchildren. Never ever condemn or speak ill of the parent your spouse divorced.

- Allow the parent you marry to be primary care-giver to his or her children, especially in discipline matters. Back up both parents in discipline and never contradict or step between discipline administered unless it is abusive.

- Seek to be a model of Christian faith and character for your stepchildren, being kind, compassionate, forgiving, firm, and loving through the faith

God gives you .

- If you have children of your own, show them and your stepchildren so very much of God's unconditional love that your children will feel they are your favorite, and your stepchildren will feel they are your favorite too.

You may never be "stepparent of the year" but, then again, through Christ's love, maybe you will.

FORGIVE WITH THANKSGIVING?

When people hurt us deeply, it is hard to forgive at all, much less forgive with thanksgiving in our hearts. Because lack of forgiveness will grow unless we stop it by showing the forgiveness of Christ, it is time to forgive with thankful hearts. It's also time to remember, the only reason we can forgive is because Jesus laid down His life so that sinners can receive strength to forgive even the most unforgivable sins.



FORGIVING OTHERS BLESSES US!

MAKE ROOM IN YOUR HEART FOR CHRIST

At the same time, it doesn't matter if you put up lights or don't put up lights, spread glitter all around the house or keep the glitter in the bag it came in, buy presents or make presents or skip presents all together. What matters is the condition of your faith in Christ and the room you make for Him in your heart.

INVITE CHRIST INTO YOUR HOME

This Christmas, ask God to help you make room for Him and put on His joyful character. Get rid of all sinful desires for material things by preparing your heart for Christ and His love to move into your home. Then, announce to your family that Christ is coming and invite your whole family to prepare for Him. If members do not want to prepare, that's OK. Your faith will welcome Christ and bless your home.

AN AWESOME GUEST

To prepare your heart and home for your awesome Guest: Read Advent devotions. Buy all presents with Christ's approval in mind. Read the entire Christmas story before gifts are opened. Thank not only gift givers, but God who supplies all the gifts given, and always thank Him for the gift of His Son. Host a "Baby Jesus" Birthday Party and give Jesus your heart!

Some members of your family will think your joyful Christmas Christian preparations strange. Do not be discouraged. Yours will be a Christmas that no one will ever forget. And, don't hesitate to do it all over again next year and every year in joyful Christmas Christian character!

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A Grandparents Guide To Character Building

IT'S GOOD TO BE A GRANDPARENT

It's good to be a grandparent. It is different than being a parent. You may actually be able to accomplish much more as a grandparent than you did as a parent. Children tend to have a better relationship with grandparents than they do with their parents. Parents make lots of rules children often do not like. Grandparents, while they need to enforce the rules made by parents, do not actually make the rules. In fact, grandparents can often have a wonderful time making everything including rules fun. *"If we can't go outside, let's have fun inside."* Problem solved!

SUPPORT YOUR CHILDREN

Actually, one good way to help build Christian character in your grandchildren is to support the decisions your children make regarding their children. You may not agree with every decision your children make, but unless it causes your grandchildren harm, support them. You may find your children more open to any ideas you may have that can help to build Christian character in their children and your grandchildren.



HERE'S HOW TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILDREN

- When you visit their home or they visit yours, compliment your children in front of their children. Let all your words and actions tell your grandchildren that you and their parents agree and love each other.
- Ask your children for advice on how to care for their children, what foods they can eat, what TV programs they can watch, etc. and be sure to always follow their instructions.
- When you visit, try to find a project, a job that needs doing, that you and your grandchildren can do together. Have great fun with your grandchildren and do something helpful for their parents at the same time: clean, bake, or even fix something, etc.

ABOVE ALL: To build Christian character in your grandchildren, display Christian character. Let your grandchildren see it as they spend time with you.

IDEAS FOR SPENDING CHARACTER BUILDING TIME WITH YOUR GRANDCHILDREN

Plan a special time to be with each grandchild and display Christian character like taking them out to eat and pray before the meal, play games and teach them to play fairly and kindly, talk about Christian character as you walk, bake, ride bike, etc. Discover and take note of things your grandchildren like to do. Each grandchild may be different. Fill out a 3X5 card with their name on it and add notes about how you can help to build Christian character when doing activities they like with them.

PROVIDE A SPECIAL PLACE

If you don't have a special corner (table and chairs, toys, etc.) for grandchildren when they visit, help them make a special box. Put toys and games they like into the box. You may need a different box for different ages of grandchildren. Get the box out when they come.

When they leave, put it back into storage, but not before you jot notes of new ways to use the items in the box to help build Christian character during their next visit.

PLAN SPECIAL CELEBRATIONS!

Let a grandchild eat from a special plate at your house when a grandchild displays Christian character: obeys, is kind, patient, etc. "You Are Special" plates can be purchased or designate any plate special. **MOST IMPORTANTLY:** Use the times spent with your grandchildren to build Christian character by sharing your faith in Christ, who alone is able to build and strengthen Christian character in grandchildren, parents, and grandparents alike.

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“Jesus” Hugs Build Christian Character

BE GENTLE

The gentleness of our touch helps to instill gentleness in all ages. It is also one of the best ways to heal the kind of violence children learn when they lack gentle touches. Gentle touches can help prevent bad behavior and build good behavior simply because they show kindness and uplift the spirit deep within.

GIVE APPROPRIATE HUGS

Sadly, there are bad and degrading hugs that should never be given to children. These hugs touch children in ways children never should be touched. They are inappropriate and send children down a path of rebellious sin and destruction. Anyone who causes a child to sin faces God’s condemnation in Matthew 18:6. Touching children in the wrong way is also criminal behavior. Because wrong touches are prevalent, it is important for us to know about “Jesus” hugs that help to prevent and heal bad touches and build not just good, but Christian character.

JESUS HUGGED CHILDREN

God’s Word encourages hugs. In Mark 10:13-16 Jesus invites little children to come to Him...*and He took the little children in His arms and blessed them.* This loving example set by our Savior should inspire and lead us to pick children up in our arms and hug them. Yet, today, we can’t always do that because a child hurt by a bad hug or touch can misinterpret and be hurt by our good hug.

DIFFERENT KINDS OF “JESUS” HUGS

When we can’t wrap our arms around a child, we may be able to hold a hand. When we do it out of love for Jesus it becomes a “Jesus” hug. A gentle squeeze of the hand can assure a child of your caring presence and love. Any way we assure a child of God’s love and ours most definitely is a “Jesus” hug. Brushing their hair may not be a “Jesus” hug, but when given out of love for God and them, it can help children feel loved and it is definitely Jesus approved.

STUFFED BEAR and BLANKET HUGS

The gift of a stuffed animal that plays “Jesus Loves Me” or actually says prayers can be a “Jesus” hug. A blanket from a person they see the love of Jesus in can be a “Jesus” hugs. A knitted blanket with a note the says, “Each stitch is a stitch of Jesus’ love and mine” can produce feelings that build faith and Christian character in children.

HUGS CHILDREN CAN HEAR

Likewise, falling asleep hearing the sound of someone singing Christian hymns or having someone to say prayers with covers children with the warmth and security of a “Jesus” hug. We can hug children with our praise. When they know we love Jesus, our praise can wrap a child tightly in His arms and ours.

LIKE A HUG

A quick kiss on the forehead has been described as a wet, gushy hug. A pat on the back, even a soft punch in the shoulder can be a hug. When these are done gently and out of love for Jesus, they can be “Jesus” hugs. Hugs are not always obvious. Did you know that seeing their parents happy can be a hug that builds security and stability in children? Seeing a parent’s faith is a “Jesus” hug that can build even stronger security and stability.



FAITH AND CHRISTIAN CHARACTER HUGS

Sometimes children want, even need, to be hugged. When we can’t hug them in our arms, we can give them a “Jesus” hug. *Sometimes children don’t want to be hugged, but desperately need hugs.* Give them “Jesus” hugs so they won’t think they are being hugged, but they will still feel and be blessed. **So will you!**

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Loving Discipline Builds Christian Character

There are excellent Christian books to help parents discipline their children successfully. The best Book, however, is the Bible. Not only does it offer the wisdom and knowledge of God, it strengthens parents to be His instruments of loving discipline, and empowers them to put on Christ, to have His character, the Christian character needed to handle the frustrations that so often overwhelm parents and their children today. Bad behavior in children can tear an entire family apart. Reading God's Word helps parents depend on God's wisdom and strength, not their own, in matters of discipline. As they do, God makes discipline successful even when families fail miserably in giving and receiving it.

SET DOWN RULES

With God and His Word firmly planted in your mind and heart, specifically plan guidelines and rules to help your child BEFORE it becomes necessary for you to use them. Decide what you will do if this behavior happens or that problem occurs - What kinds of behavior will you reward? - What consequences will you allow your child to suffer? What punishments will you use to correct bad behavior?



DISCIPLINE IN LOVE

The "rod of correction" in Proverbs 13:24 administered physically (spanking) out of love for God and children can calm out-of-control children. However, parents can easily spank in frustration or even anger over bad behavior. Children punished in anger become angry. If parents feel angry or appear angry, a spanking is more likely to hurt than help a child. And there are other means of administering the "rod of correction" that may work much better.

UNDERSTAND THE ROD OF LOVE

The "rod of correction" does not need to be physical discipline. This rod can require a child to think of ways to turn the wrong done into right or good. More than one child not wanting to think of the good they should do has pleaded, "Just spank me and get it over with!"

LOVING DISCIPLINE CAN HURT

Not allowing a child to attend a fun activity, taking away a toy, a cell phone, etc. until behavior improves, making a child work to pay to replace a broken item, etc. have been called *spanking a child where it hurts*. And, yes, it can hurt parents more or at least as much as their child when loving discipline means they must give up something they like to carry out the discipline of their child needs. At the same time, loving discipline does not always need to hurt or be about consequences or punishment.

PRAISE WORKS

Begin constantly watching for good behavior, even if it is hard to see and occurrences are few and far between. Praising even the tiniest good behavior has proven to be a *rod of correction* that grows more good behavior. Compliments are uplifting and can improve behavior all by themselves. Adding God's love to the equation works wonders on the behavior and the character of parents and children alike.

BE TRANSPARENT

As children see God's love in their parents, they recognize their parents's discipline as love. So be sure your children see God's love in you through all you say and do. Let them see you in worship, reading God's Word, and praying with them and for them. As you do these things, God will grow your faith and character to discipline in His love. Your children will see His love in your discipline and pass God's loving discipline on for generations.

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Christian Character Leads Teens to Good Choices

PARENTS INFLUENCE TEENS

Much emphasis is placed on the things teens see on television, at the movies, at school, and hear from their friends. In fact, these are thought to be a major influence on the lives of teenagers. Yet, recent studies suggest that parents and families continue to have as much or more influence on teenagers than media, school, and friends, especially when it comes to building Christian faith and character.

TEENS ARE WATCHING

My personal experience as a youth worker for almost 40 years has shown me that teens watch adults closely. They hear what we say and analyze it, especially when we think they aren't listening.

I cannot count the times I have heard, "Remember when you said...?" from a teenager I never thought was listening. Teens watch to see if what we say in some way contradicts what we said earlier. Teenagers really keep you on the straight and narrow. If you have done a good job teaching teens to do what's right, they will watch to see if you always do what's right. And, they will make their decisions and choices based on what they see and hear.

DON'T JUST SAY IT - DO IT!

Be advised, the things adults do wrong do not have to be all that bad to raise questions in the eyes of teens. Teens pick at the very foundation of our faith and lives. They take careful note when we speed. They keep records of when we put someone down, especially if we constantly tell them not to put others down. When we stay up too late, don't get our work done, act crabby, don't keep a promise or fulfill a responsibility, they remind us. If we want to influence teens to save their money, they better see us saving our money. If we desire to build Christian character that leads to good choices, we had better not only display Christian character, it must permeate our lives and our souls for the whole world to see because our teens are watching us!

TAKE RESPONSIBILITY

It is easy to pin the blame for the bad choices some teens are making on a bad world. Violence is out of control. Sex is running rampant. Alcohol and drugs flow freely. Lying and cheating have become a way of life for too many people. Certainly seeing all of this bad behavior takes its toll on teenagers. But the bad behavior and non-Christian character of others is not the only behavior that influences teenagers. If teens see their parents making bad choices, they can be more influenced and likely to contemplate doing the same.

More importantly or dangerously is the fact that when teens see parents making bad choices they question the value of what parents say. They are less likely to listen to their parents, and more likely to make bad choices. The good news is that teens can also be influenced by Christian character. With all of the bad choices made today, teens need Christians whose faithful behavior can lead them to Christ for faith and strength to make good choices.



CONFESS WRONGS

For parents and other Christians to be faithful witnesses to teens we need to confess our sins to God and to our teens. We may not appreciate it when teens catch us making a bad choice, but we can be thankful for the opportunity to say, "I'm sorry... I was wrong" because these are the words that can help teens make good choices. It may seem unnecessary and certainly isn't easy to confess our sins to teens. Yet, when we do, we display Christian character, make the line between right and wrong clear, and help our teens make good choices.

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Christian Character Does What Is Good and Right

PARENTING REQUIRES EXPLAINING

When we were kids, our parents told us to do something and we did it (most of the time) without a question. Back then, no one thought of questioning their parents. Today, many children not only question their parents, but expect their parents to explain in great detail why something needs to be done, and they debate over whether they have to do it. This can be annoying for those of us who were not given any choice. Yet, it is a good parental practice that keeps kids safe today.

CHILDREN HAVE CHOICES

In the past, parents and society made good choices for their children. There were set rules to follow. Some obeyed. Others didn't. But the rules were there. Today, parents help their children make good choices because society doesn't always teach what is good. Of course, it doesn't matter if parents make good choices for their children or help their children make good choices, as long as good choices are being made. The problem in every generation has to do with children knowing what is good, choosing good, and actually being able to do what is good.

CHOICES ARE MORE DIFFICULT

I think it was easier for me *not* to have a choice. And I surely and thankful I did not have to make the choices children have to make today. The world didn't tell me, "You can choose to have sex or abstain." The world didn't shout, "It's OK to cheat. Everyone is doing it!" I thought everyone was suppose to abstain and be honest. The right choices today are not as definite about right and wrong. Small children have to be able to make the right choices to stay safe amidst media hype that too often teaches them right is wrong and wrong is right. This confusion has made it essential for parents to do a lot of explaining about the difference between right and wrong and also why people need to do what is right.



CHILDREN NEED JESUS

And, we must face facts. Even parents who do an exceptional job of explaining the difference between right and wrong can fail at one small point that turns out to be very important. Problems and horrendous tragedies can arise because parents simply cannot teach their children enough about how to stay safe from every single danger. There are so many dangers. And they cannot always be present when their children need to make the right decisions. This is exactly why parents need to teach their children about the One who

can guide and strengthen their children to not only know but do what is right - Jesus! He is always present 24/7. He will always lead them in the way of righteousness - to do all that is right and good. Those who learn of Him and follow Him will be helped to have His character - Christian character that is able to make the right choices.

THE WORLD IS BLESSED

Finally, children of the past whose parents made good choices for them did not do what was right all the time. Today, children who are given many choices and have choices explained to them, may not make the right choices all the time. But children whose parents teach them about Jesus can be sure He will help them not just to know but He will strengthen them to choose and do what is good and right and safe for themselves, for others, and ultimately for the world for generations.

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Christian Character Strengthens Commitment

CHOOSE TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER

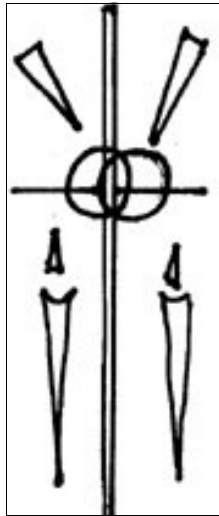
“Love is not an emotion. It's a choice!” The first time I heard that statement, I couldn't wait for an opportunity to use it. It is so beautiful - so profound - and so absolutely true! When we make a commitment to love another person for the rest of our lives, it cannot be based on emotions. Our emotions change constantly. Just ask my husband. My mood can change from nice to nasty in a second. He surely doesn't FEEL love for me when I am nasty. He chooses to love me and I love him more for making that choice. If you want your marriage to last, right now make a commitment to love each other and read on to discover how you can keep that commitment *“until death do us part.”*

KEEP YOUR COMMITMENT

Making a choice to love another person for the rest of our lives doesn't mean we will always feel love for that person. It does mean we have committed to love that person; not because we have to; not because we pretend to; not because we valiantly attempt to, but because we choose to especially, I might add, when that person is completely unlovable. Right now, you are thinking that's impossible! Simply choosing to love another person does not make it so. Well, actually, it does. However, if you fear you cannot make that choice or that commitment, help is available. God offers strength of faith through Christ to help us choose to love one another. This is the same faith and strength from which strong Christian character emerges, character that is able to make a vow and commitment and stand by it until death.

MAKE YOUR JOY COMPLETE

It is true that some marriages do last without faith and love for God as their foundation. But, they do not last in the same way marriages founded on Christ last. 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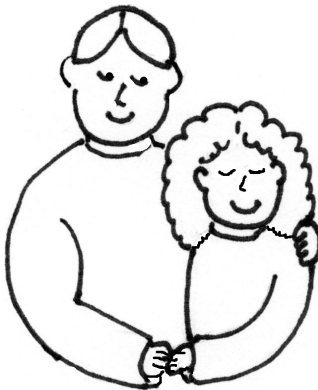
Christian Character Saves Marriages

PARENTING DOESN'T STOP

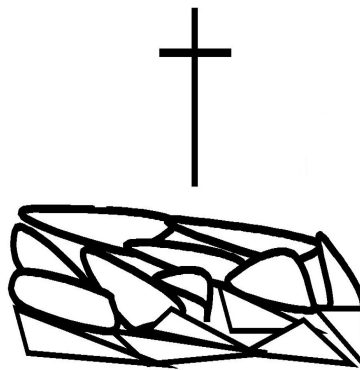
